- **Old Post Office Clock Tower** - A highlight of a visit to the Old Post Office Pavilion is always a 360-degree picturesque view of Washington. From the observation deck of the 315-foot granite Clock Tower, enjoy the city's second highest vantage point after the Washington Monument.
- **Madame Tussaud's Wax Museum** - Have you ever wanted to kiss one of Hollywood's celebrities such as Brad Pitt or Tyra Banks? Or simply see if you were taller than George Washington? Well this is the place in Washington DC where you can do it all. The premier wax attraction will give visitors an interactive, full-sensory experience; they will be able to touch, see and hear major historical events and celebrities in a way unlike any other Washington DC attraction.
